Most groups that raise funds to help cancer patients dedicate the money to research. And their efforts have certainly saved lives. **But sometimes cancer patients need more direct help, such as when they face medical and utility bills and don't know how they'll pay them.**

That's when the Hammonton Cancer Foundation and the South Jersey Cancer Fund step in to help. Both are all-volunteer groups. **No one receives a salary and they use only a tiny portion of the funds they raise for expenses such as telephone, postage and printing.** The foundation donates the funds it raises to the South Jersey group, which **since 1965 has aided thousands of cancer patients.**
